

COMMUNITY HEALTH AND SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM GRANTS



Wilmar Sugar Australia Limited owns and operates the Plane Creek Mill in Queensland's Central Region.

The Plane Creek Community Health and Safety Improvement Program (CHSIP) has been established to provide grants to community groups in the Plane Creek milling region.

The three-year program commenced in 2020. This year represents the final round of funding available through the program. A total of **\$10,000** in funding is being offered in 2022 to support community health and safety projects. Grants of \$2,000 or more are available to support successful applicants.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR A CHSIP GRANT?

The CHSIP grants are open to a wide range of community organisations. Eligible applicants must:

- Be a "not-for-profit" organisation
- Be located within the broader Plane Creek Mill cane supply region and provide services within that region
- Either hold an ABN or be able to have a third party auspice the grant on its behalf
- Provide evidence of current insurance status in respect of public liability and professional indemnity

HOW TO APPLY FOR A CHSIP GRANT?
